## Letter from Rabbi Cohen

My dear friends at Temple Sinai

I send greetings from London, England as Rosh Hashanah moves closer. Sarah, Elijah and I will be with you soon and are bursting with energy and excitement at the prospect of becoming part of the Temple Sinai family.

A couple of weeks ago Sarah, Elijah and I were moving out of our house in a neighborhood of London called Bounds Green although Elijah is only 15 months so he didn't do much of the heavy lifting! Sarah and I were staring at the moving truck stationed outside our property as the men from Simpsons Moving Company put all of our possessions in boxes.

I do not know how many times you and your families have moved but there is a compartmentalization of one's life at such a moment. We had to decide which possessions to ship to Vegas, which clothes and objects we needed more immediately to take on the plane, which items to recycle or throw away and which to lock away in our attic.

As the removal truck was being loaded, Elijah looked at me as if to say, "Dad what's going on, why are they taking all our stuff? And it occurred to me that life at this time of year is much like the experience of moving because it mirrors the dynamic nature of human experience, the constant moving on to the next phase, the continual need to assess and learn from previous events.

We work out what we take with us and what we leave behind. We sort through not just our possessions but also our experiences, our relationships and our achievements - many have been worthwhile but there are some which we may find it wiser to discard, to put away in some musty corner of the attic and never revisit!

In the words of one of my teachers\*, "There is a story that is told in every culture, in every religion, in folk tales, in legends and in our dreams. It is the story of the journey of a hero or heroine in search of a treasure. Every version of it is different, yet every version is also really the same. The hero is called out of his usual life - by seeing a burning bush, by hearing a voice saying: "Lech I'cha! Go! For your own sake, go!"

Rosh Hashanah calls us out of our usual life to "move", to go on a journey to find the treasure of self-discovery and development. The journey is truly immense as we move away from the past year to the year ahead. My family and I look forward to sharing it with you. ~Rabbi Malcolm Cohen

### A Note from the Cantor

“On Rosh Hashanah it is written, on Yom Kippur it is sealed:”

These are words of a poem we read every year at our New Year season. Will we be written into the Book of Life?

“On Rosh Hashanah it is written, on Yom Kippur it is sealed:”

How many shall pass on, how many shall come to be; ...who shall be secure, and who shall be driven;”

As we read these words, we reflect on the deeds we have done in the past year. We reflect on the events that shaped our lives.

“On Rosh Hashanah it is written, on Yom Kippur it is sealed:”

who shall be tranquil and who shall be troubled; ...who shall be humbled, and who exalted.”

We look to the New Year as one of great possibilities. The past is over, but what did we learn from it? Were we able to learn patience? Did we fulfill the mitzvah of doing acts of kindness? 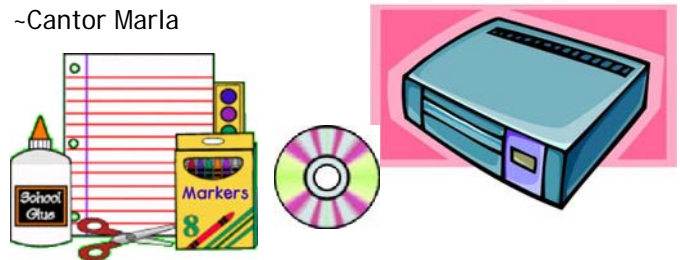
great as you can be. That is all that can be asked of any of us.

## Adult Day Care Centers of Las Vegas and Henderson

Nevada Senior Services is pleased to announce receipt of a grant from the State of Nevada Aging and Disability Services Division apportioned in part to the Adult Day Care Center of Las Vegas (Jones) and in part to Adult Day Care Center of Henderson. The grant is for the period October 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010. We are extremely happy that given the substantial number of funding reductions by the State of Nevada and extremely high level of competition for grants at this time, we were able to achieve a substantial net increase in funding.

But wait there's more...the prestigious Brookdale Foundation has selected the Adult Day Care Center of Henderson to receive a grant to establish an "Early Memory Loss Program" at the Center. The award competition is highly competitive and national. This is the first Brookdale award in Nevada and we are honored to be selected. We anticipate a two month planning process with input from physicians and neuropsychologists specializing in memory loss, other area agencies including the Alzheimer's Association, Touro University Occupational Therapy, UNLV Schools of Social Work and Nursing, Nevada Division for Aging Services, and the Center for Creative Therapeutic Arts (Music Therapy).

Also, Our Laugh Therapy Caregiver Forum, held on August 12th in the Sanctuary, yielded record attendance and record enthusiasm. Speaker, Dr. Upinder Singh, was outstanding and had the vary engaged crowd up and out of their seats laughing and participating. ~Jeff Klein



## Temple Sinai Board of Trustees Meeting Minutes July 14, 2009

Rabbi Cohen is scheduled to arrive in August; we have a full weekend planned with Friday service, Saturday barbecue, and Sunday ice cream social. Sisterhood is having a "kitchen shower" for Mrs. Cohen. As he has had a long relationship with the Farrell family, Rabbi Segel will conduct a Bat Mitzvah on August 22nd.

Myron reported on the entire 2008 - 2009 fiscal year. Our three million dollar operation finished the year in the black, in spite of the economy, due to generous donors. Larry reported that the deal for Clear Wire to pay us for allowing them to erect a computer data relay is dead due to Summerlin declaring a moratorium.

In the membership discussion, Judy volunteered to be Ombudsman, listen to member concerns, and bring them to the board. Larry reminded us of the 10% discount at either Shenker or Adult Day Care for members.

This year we are adopting the URJ Chai Curriculum for the Religious School. It integrates all the grades and encourages parent involvement. We will be starting Hebrew a year earlier at fourth grade. A first draft of the B'nai Mitzvah Handbook has been prepared.

Sisterhood is planning a New York Night fund raiser, jointly with the Men's Club. On Rosh Hashanah they will provide apples and honey, as is customary.

Beth reported that she is arranging the URJ's "Taste of Judaism" which provides classes, with materials, as an outreach program. She also followed up with the 92nd Street Y. They provide lectures via satellite.

Kap reported that Shari Schwartz is doing publicity. The information is to be funneled through Debra. The Israelite put Rabbi Cohen on page 1. The article was also run by the Reporter and the View. Frank suggested that we specifically publicize the fact that we welcome mixed couples to our High Holiday services.

Kap speaks with the immigration attorney daily about Rabbi Cohen. Kap stated that we have Shelly Berkley and Harry Reid available; but was told that the involvement of politicians usually slows things down. Archie asked about Plan "B" and was told that Rabbi Brooks is available to hold services if necessary.

Attendance at meetings is only part of the board members' duty, so Larry had us each select committees.
