## Temple Sinai Minimum Suggested Temple Support Fiscal Year July 1, 2009 – June 30, 2010

As a Temple Sinai member, you will receive many benefits. You will be able to participate in Shabbat Services, social and educational events. We will all watch our young children grow as young Jews into beautiful bar or bat mitzvahs. You will experience the joys and sorrows of your Temple Sinai extended family. To enable Temple Sinai to provide you these benefits, we need your financial support. The level of support is listed here, for your convenience:

### Membership Unit Definitions:

A family membership is either a husband and wife or domestic partners, living in the same household, with or without minor children, or children enrolled in a college or university up to the age of 25, or in the military service.

**This category doesn't include grandparents, parents, adult children, grandchildren, sister-in-laws, brother-in-laws, mother-in-laws, father-in-laws, etc.**

A single membership is an individual with or without children living in the same household, or children enrolled in a college or university up to the age of 25, or in the military service



To make budgeting for temple support easier, we can set up a pay-as-you-go monthly payment schedule using your MasterCard, Visa or DiscoverCard. This program is available to a maximum of 10 months ending no later than June 30, 2010. Also, a 5% discount is available for full category annual support, paid in full, by August 31, 2009. In order to receive tickets for High Holy Day Services, you must have paid at least 50% of your annual support level by August 31, 2009 or have set up a pay-as-you-go credit card monthly payment plan.

### **\*\*BUILDING FUND**

To maintain and improve the existing facilities the board has adopted a building fund commitment for each member of \$2,500, which can be paid over a five year period with a contribution of at least \$500 per year.

Members who have already paid a building fund at another temple or synagogue may receive special consideration, per the Union of Reform Judaism's program, that Temple Sinai has adopted. Please contact Les Jacobs at the temple (254-5110) for further information.

### **\*\*\*YOUNG FAMILY MEMBER**

This category was created by the board of trustees to assist young families, when joining our temple. The young family member price level is open to all families, whose head of household is 35 years old and younger. These households will enjoy the full benefits of membership at a lower support level for the first two years. Also, during this two-year period, the building fund will be deferred.

### **\*\*\*\*SECURITY**

The Temple Sinai security fee is going enable us to provide more video and human surveillance on the Hillpointe campus. As recent events have shown us no system is foolproof, so we are developing a layered approach to security. We can't be a fortress, but vigilance is a necessity.



## RELIGIOUS (SUNDAY) SCHOOL FEES

The first day of Religious School for the 2009-2010 school year will be on Sunday, August 30, 2009 at 9:30 a.m. sharp. Registration forms will be mailed by early August or can be picked up at the temple office.

Religious School is held each Sunday and Tuesday, with holidays and breaks following the Clark County School District's schedule. Each child receives weekly religious and Hebrew training under the hands-on direction of Cantor/Religious School Director, Marla Goldberg. Our Religious School teachers reflect professionalism and high quality. Religious school fees must be paid before your child starts school.

## B'NAI MITZVAH FEES

Temple Sinai looks forward to preparing your child to be called to the Torah as a Bar or Bat Mitzvah. In preparation, your child will receive one-on-one sessions with our Rabbi and Cantor, while learning his or her Bar or Bat Mitzvah service and Torah portion. The board of trustees has adopted a B'nai Mitzvah fee of \$500 and this fee must be paid before your child begins his or her sessions.
